Prepping for Day One:

Day One of preschool can be an emotional (mostly exciting) day! Here are some tips to help you and your child transition into the school year!

- Talk about school often and excitedly: Help your child know what
 to expect and mention elements of school that may be most
 appealing to them (climbing room, snack, recess, etc)
- Discuss who your child will see there: Use teacher names, talk about Dusk (the Guinea Pig), and mention any familiar friends
- **Be specific:** Tell your child where you will be while they're at school, when you will see them next, and what will happen after school
- Communicate with our teachers! We know it's a big deal and we want to support you through this transition!
